Kia ora!

Nau mai, haere mai and welcome to our first Pānui for 2023.

It has been a difficult and in many places devastating start to the year with floods and Cyclone Gabrielle impacting communities and whānau across Te Ika-a-Māui.

Experience in Aotearoa and internationally has shown that family violence (including intimate partner violence, child abuse and elder abuse) and sexual violence can escalate during and after large-scale disasters or crises. However, it is also important to remember that disasters are not the cause of family, whānau or sexual violence. DVFREE have shared some useful messaging that gives context to what we can expect to see and also how workplaces can support their staff.

MSD is managing the \$11.5 million Community Support Package to help those affected by the recent North Island floods and Cyclone Gabrielle. This includes funding for providers, community groups, community food providers, Community Connectors and disabled people.

The National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) has information on the emergency response and available support including fact sheets in different languages and alternative formats.

Kim's appointment reflects our continuing journey towards centring Te Tiriti in the work of the Clearinghouse.
